2. Strengthening Agriculture

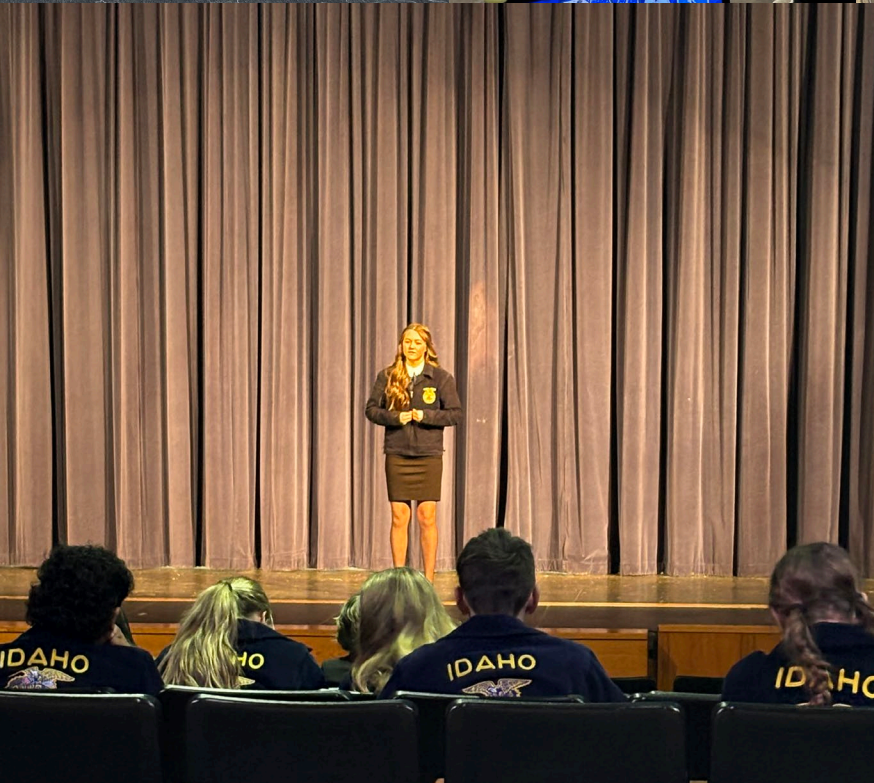
- 46 members are currently signed up to participate in the Twin Falls County Fair.

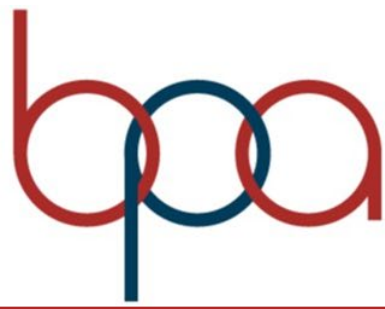

Concert/Pep Band

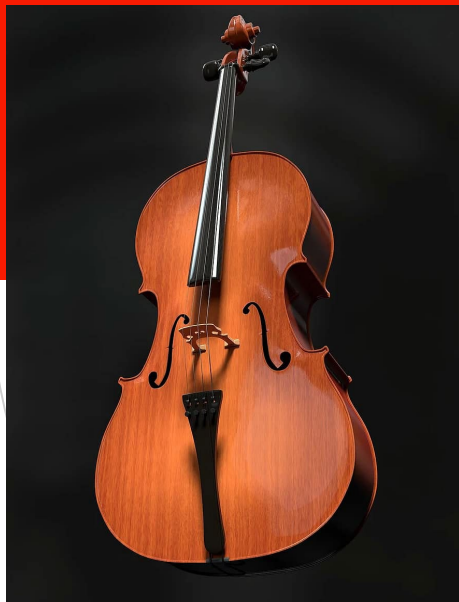


- Performed at 26 Pep Band games (football & basketball)

Concert Choir



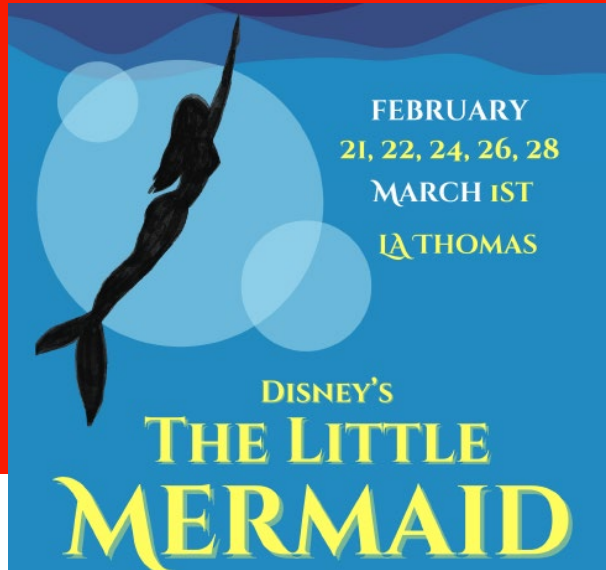
- Performed concerts in October, December, March and May
