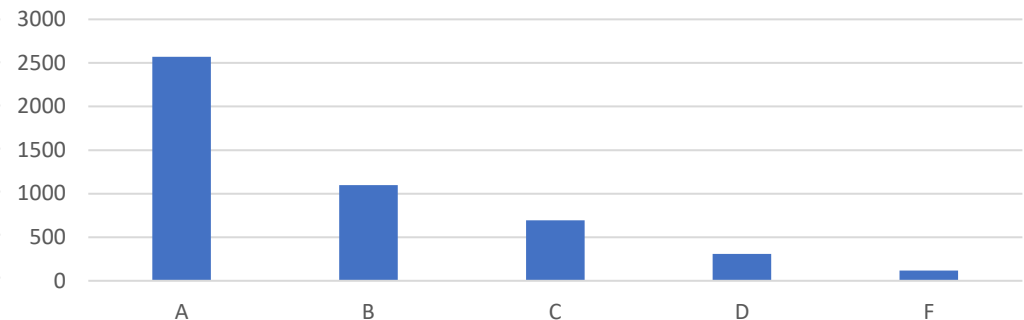

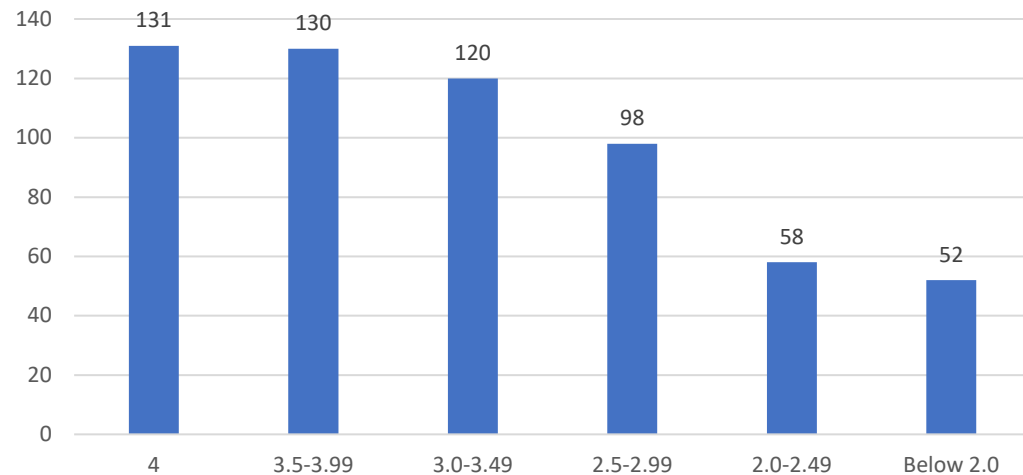

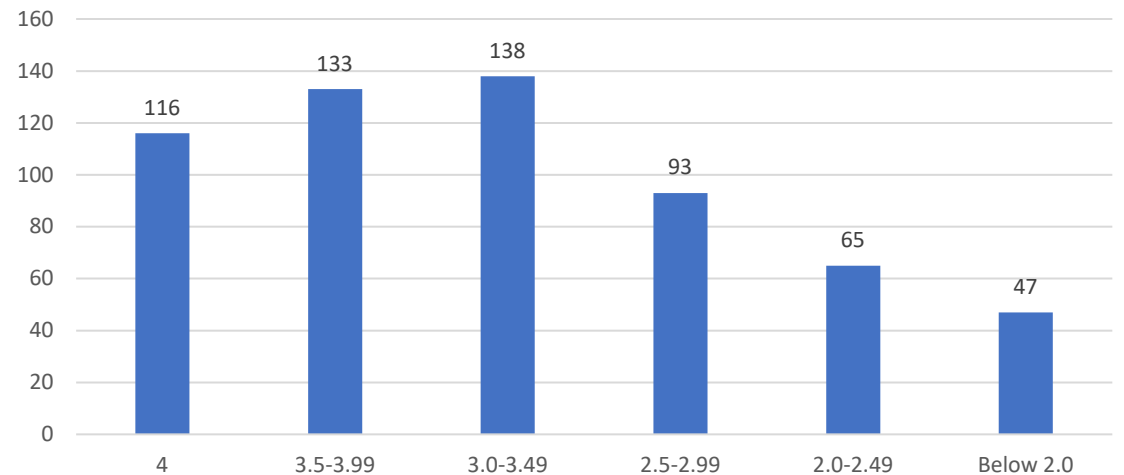

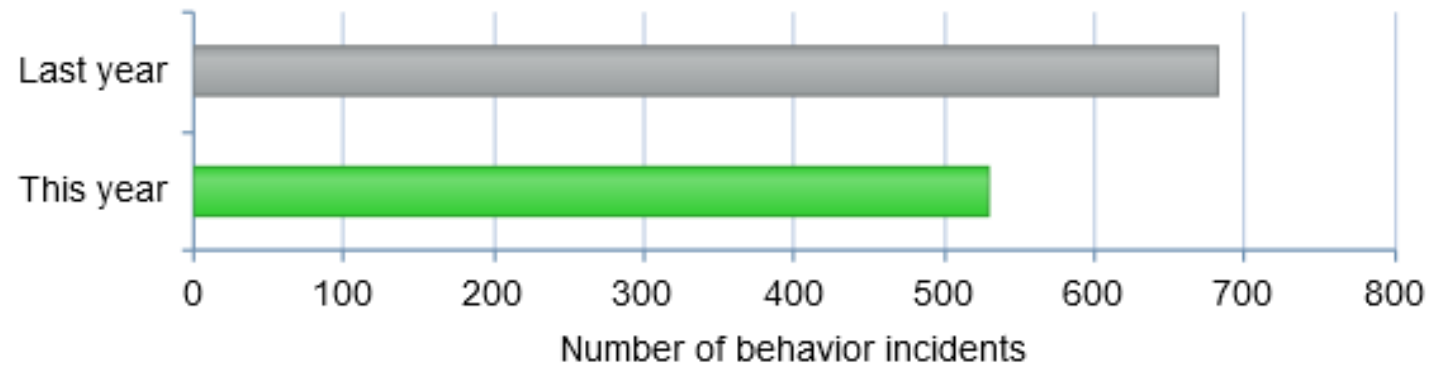
GPA's S1 2023-2024

# Discipline report recognition 2023-2024

# Attendance 2023-2024

Kimberly High School reported an attendance rate of 89% for the year.

FA status is reached when a student has more than 5 absences (not school related) on a block day schedule in a semester.

1<sup>st</sup> semester

- 78 students (13%) reached FA status
- 470 hours of seat time made up

2<sup>nd</sup> semester

- 126 students (21%) reached FA status
- 740 hours of seat time made up

The U.S. is in an era of chronic absenteeism. Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% or more of school days. I recently returned from a training in Boise hosted by the state department of education. KHS will have a plan to address and educate families to help reduce absences.

The goal for all students will be to attend **162 out of the 171 school days** or to miss only 1 day per month. This equals a 95% attendance rate which is considered regular attendance.

Students will track their weekly attendance in advisory to understand the importance of regular attendance.

# KHS Counselors (Jolene Nannini, Debbie Klug, and Stephanie Buckley)

## **Jolene Nannini (full-time)**

Jolene counsels' students academically and for mental health. She had over 200 visits for mental health this year (more than 1 per day). Some students only need a few minutes with her while others may need 1-2 hours. She never turns a student away and is very patient and understanding with all students.

Jolene is responsible for the verification of seniors meeting the graduation requirement of 52 credits. She works with students and helps guide them to the finish line. She assists students needing to recover credits through IDLA, Magic Valley High School, and KHS summer school. She also oversees the dual-credit program with CSI. She makes sure class listing are uploaded to PowerSchool and recorded correctly on our transcripts.

## **Debbie Klug (part-time)**

Debbie assists Jolene and helps organize PSAT and SAT testing days. She also assists with the college and career fair, senior presentations, registration, and graduation. She has been a valuable mentor for Jolene over the years and has a wealth of counseling knowledge.

## **Stephanie Buckley (half-time)**

Stephanie has built the Senior resource webpage that contains important information for all students. She is very tech savvy and led the movement to take the PSAT and SAT on the computer. She runs the college and career fair getting vendors from all over the Magic Valley to attend. She assists with senior presentations, registration, and graduation. She also ran two FAFSA nights to assist parents with this task. KHS had a 53% completion rate which was above the state average.

Teachers in ELA and Math will increase the time spent on prepping for the SAT in 2024-2025.


