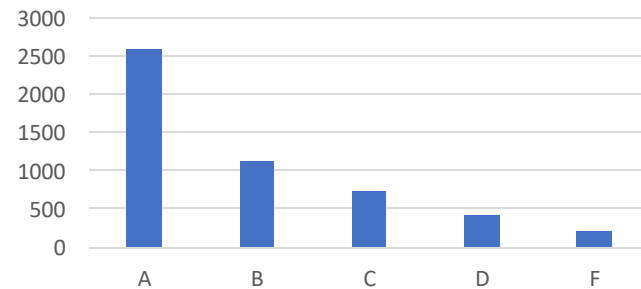

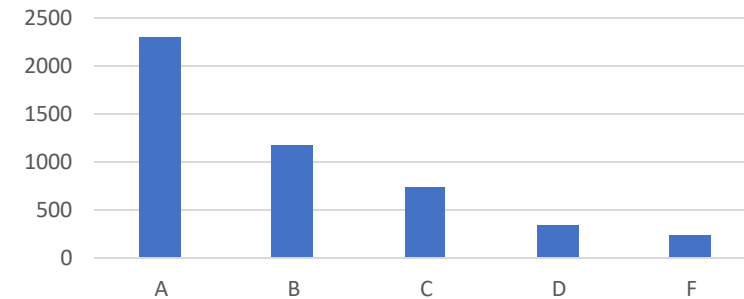

Grade Count-Semester 2 (22-23)

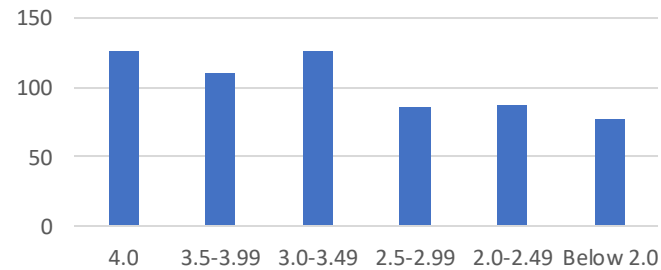

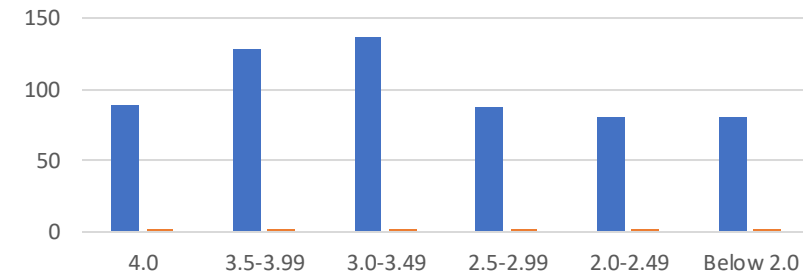

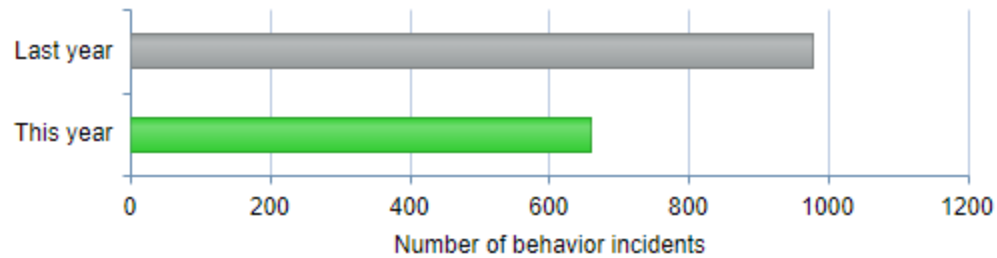
GPA breakdown S1 (22-23)

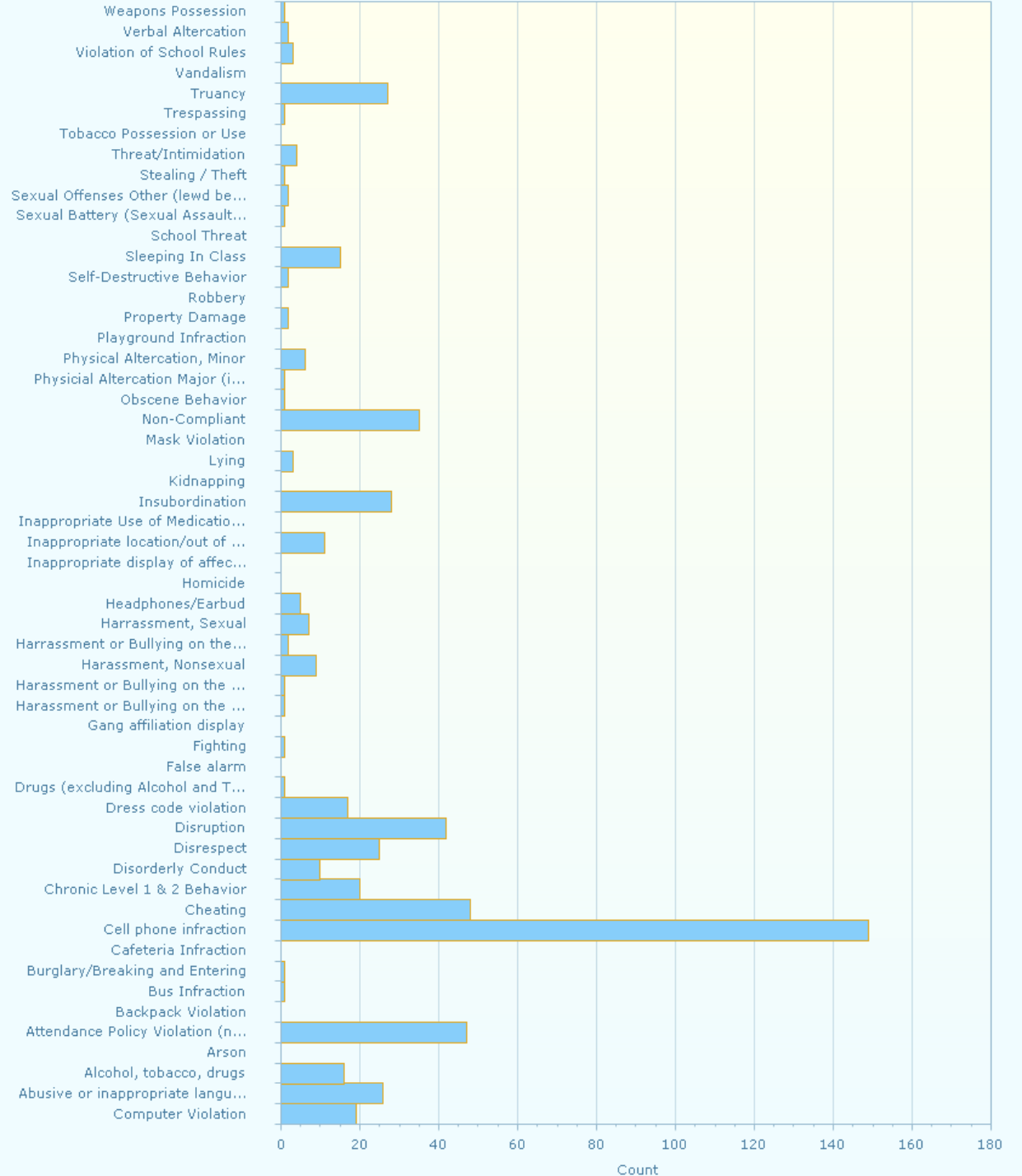

Attendance

- This year we have required students to not have more than 5 block day absences for any class on campus in order to receive a credit.
- In the fall semester, students paid back 200 hours of seat time.
- This semester, students have paid back 340 hours of seat time.
- We want to emphasize that students need to show up in order to graduate, we are an in-person school.

Athletics (Zach Dong)

- Zach Dong has done a tremendous job taking over high school athletics.
- Zach has hired some outstanding coaches.
- KHS athletics have won 9 district championships this year (6 in the spring).
- KHS athletics have won 3 state titles (so far) this year. Volleyball, Boys Cross Country, and Boys Golf
- Rumor is we will have close to 90 boys out for football.

Quarter Awards

- Each quarter, 60 students have received various awards for good behavior, perfect attendance, or a 3.5 or higher GPA
- Awards range from \$5 gift certificates, hoodies, \$25 Amazon gift cards, and \$50 Visa gift cards
